- Please let us know all the items you've brought. We may be able to help with more than one, depending on how busy we are and the type of repairs.
- Repairs come first. Alterations (like taking up a hem) may be possible if we have time and it's not too busy.
- $\overline{\mathbf{N}}$ One session = one fair share. If your repair takes a long time (over 20–30 mins), we may not be able to take on additional work for you in that session. If your repair is quick, we can hopefully do more repairs for you.
- Our volunteers choose the jobs that best suit their skills. Some volunteers are quicker, others more detailed — we'll match your job to the right person.
- ☐ We encourage you to have a go yourself! Volunteers are happy to support where possible — it's part of the fun!
- Please be respectful. This is a community project run by volunteers we're here to help, not provide a professional tailoring service.
- ltems must be clean. For hygiene and safety reasons, we can only work on clean clothing and accessories.
- Sometimes we'll ask you to bring something next time. If your repair needs a specific zip, elastic, button, or other part, and we don't have it, we'll ask you to bring it with you another time. We're not able to keep spares.
- Thank you for understanding that we may not be able to do every job, but we will always try our best to help.
